- In 1917, Congress elects a new committee, which is now dominated by Bolsheviks.
- The Bolsheviks were unhappy and walked out of Congress. They took over the government in complete control.
- With the collapse of the PG on Oct 26, the second Congress of Soviets declared itself the authority of Russia. A new form of government - Socialism, with Lenin as chairman and Trotsky as commissar to the foreign affairs - was established.
- Although workers and peasants were behind Lenin, Bolsheviks still had limited power outside of Petrograd. Civil servants, such as the army, post and rail workers, were reluctant to serve under them.
- To show Lenin to have the word, Lenin made a decree on land, factories and land. These guarantees an immediate end to the war and the abolition of private ownership, respectively.
- Lenin also gave many benefits to workers and soldiers, attempting to get their support against the Bolsheviks.

Suppression
of Opposition

- In Nov 1917, a system of elected people's committees was created.
- Propaganda campaign was started against political and class enemies, particularly the bourgeoisie. Class system was abolished.
- In Dec, when the Cheka was established, it imprisoned leading Kadets, Mensheviks, and right-wing Social Revolutionaries.

From what I know of the war, no, they have a treaty.
Evaluation: I think it's a clear conclusion. The whites (only whites lost)
are the ones in this, overall. Although the Russians did not
win the war, their geographical advantage and outposts
is what won. In addition, the Whites never agreed on any days,
with the British. Kottikov has own army. But really, it was
